We need assistance with the booth, so let us know when you are available.

The Club also needs your input as we search for an optimum site for our Field Day activities. The usual site at Hillcrest Park is not available this year due to City work on the park and water tank. Location options should include; public exposure, area for antennas, shelter potential, and restroom availability. If you have ideas of a good site please contact one of the Club Board members with your suggestion. Field Day will be upon us sooner than we expect, so give us your suggestions ASAP.

Antennas in the Park is also just around the corner – Saturday, May 13. As always, the activity will be at Tri-City Park in Placentia. We are targeting a location in the northeast corner of the Park as used last year. We will be setting up HF, VHF and UHF gear (with antennas, of course) for those who want to be on the air at the event. Hopefully, we can use this as a good introduction to ham radio for the public that may be in the park. One of the planned events is a hidden transmitter hunt (fox hunt). Activities will begin at about 10:00AM and continue to at least 3:00PM – depending on the successes of foxhunters. Bring your lunch. There will be plenty of Bar-B-Q space if you want to cook your own burgers, steaks or hot dogs.

APRIL CLUB PROGRAM

In the last decade, railroads have removed the wire lines that ran along the tracks and replaced the signaling circuits that they carried with modern wide area networks that can use fiber optic, microwave and radio links. The specific system architecture and communications protocol most generally used today, nationwide, is known as ATCS. Activity on local ATCS digital radio links, in particular, allows hobbyists to eavesdrop on nearby railroad operations in real time. A lot of this technology will be familiar to hams interested in the digital modes.

The April Fullerton Radio Club meeting presentation will briefly cover railroad dispatching, signaling concepts and general train operation. The meaning and implementation of ATCS will be explained and the hardware and software necessary to monitor the ATCS protocol will be discussed. The challenges for the hobbyist in making sensible use of received data will also be discussed. A live demonstration of software, using real time signals from both radio and the Internet, will provide a dynamic situation display of local rail lines. The audience will be able to see where the trains are and watch their progress on a display similar to that used by the railroad dispatcher. We might even be able to anticipate a train or two as they pass by the meeting site.


