Other hobbies and interests have consumed me this past month. I restore antique scientific instruments and this month I have been repairing a 125-year old Wimshurst electrostatic generator that took a bad fall. The challenge is to find materials consistent with those originally used and to make the repairs virtually invisible! We are fortunate today to build electronics using a wide assortment of specialized plastics. But, 125 years ago very few dielectric materials existed. So, what did they use when an insulator was needed? You may be surprised! I'll bring some examples.

This month we will have a potpourri program, including a video of an amateur, building from-scratch a working vacuum tube. Until I saw this, I would not have imagined this possible! Metal fabrication and glass blowing combine with characterization testing and actual operation in a receiver to make this a very interesting demonstration of what can be done at home. You simply have to see this to believe it!

We have numerous new members this year and that is very good news. Some are new hams, some are new just to our club and at least one is returning to amateur radio after a long absence. Tom Fiske, our ham-returnee, recently upgraded to Extra and even got a really cool new call—AA6TF. Many of you have renewed already but some still need to do so.
