Fullerton Radio Club History

59 YEARS IN DEVELOPMENT--FULLERTON RADIO CLUB... ON OUR WAY INTO THE FUTURE

Many of us, new, long timer or "old timer" FRC members might be surprised at some of the legacy of our club's member's historical contributions.

An example, Paul Lieb, KH6HME, from Anaheim in 1947 attended Fullerton J.C. Paul and I met on 2 meters just as frequency stable VHF WWII surplus was evolving. Paul's move to Hawaii and his great VHF & UHF interests have led to worldwide recognition of tropo-ducting via transpacific propagation. Paul's is one of six organizers on FRC's 1950 "Articles of Incorporation".

This was forcefully brought to mind in mid October, when I sadly learned that my close friend and 30-year work associate, Orris Flatten, W6IEP had joined the SK (Silent Key) group of hams. Orris moved to this area on earning a MSEE from Stanford in 1952 to work with us on Daylight Star Trackers at North American Aviation in Downey.

Orris soon joined year old Fullerton Radio club. He soon became extremely busy because his high school age entrepreneur brother-in-law needed technical help to become a millionaire by the time he was 21 years old. One of Orris's many resulting important patents include the famous intravenous infusion pumps & monitors, today widely used in hospitals worldwide. He retired in 1983 and moved to Durango CO keeping in touch on HF as an active ham and Dad to his large family.

Few in FRC today remember him so this set of comments was written both in memory of my close friend Orris, and to draw attention to the fact that our nearly 60 year old club has been, and continues to be home to a highly creative,

distinguished, and unique group of Hams and close friends giving back in public service.

As you renew your membership this year don't fail to notice the remarkable level of activities that we can still contribute our interests to. My money is on the expectation that even more remarkable contributions by FRC members will surprise us in the future.

By the way, check out who were the authors of the authoritative book on T-hunting "<u>Transmitter Hunting Radio Direction Finding Simplified</u>". It's become the standard reference on the subject.

Further, who in FRC pioneered the nationally recognized hospital emergency support organization using Ham radio volunteers? That generous idea is still spreading.

Also, notice that FRC's 2010 program offers many chances for more communications practice through public service.
