Old Business:

Tax and corp fillings status: Gaccione report – As of 10-12-2020, we are still not a tax exempt entity. The FTB website says it may take up to 4 months to process, and that we will get a grant letter if we're approved. We submitted the application at the end of November 2019.


TAG Activity Report (Technical Advisory Group) of the Fullerton Radio Club for October 2020



At the left are most of the guys for the October TAG Zoom meeting. The theme for the evening was "atomic clocks" under \$100. Larry, Dennis and other hams own the real thing "atomic" clocks which they use as frequency standards. But I'm talking about so called atomic clocks for the house which are really ULF receivers of signals from Colorado; WWVB.

Larry McDavid is the real expert and did most of the explaining. Your reporter here... Walter Clark took his laptop on a tour of his house. First showing what looks like a ham shack, but better described as a man cave. He then showed his remodeled kitchen which features a new corner window which make the view of his back yard appear to be 180 degrees. He then showed his clocks that are actually ULF receivers. The location of the clock under the TV screen (see picture below and to the right) is ideal for the way he uses a clock. But behind it is the chimney. Although brick is somewhat transparent to radio waves. Larry suggested that the rebar in the chimney blocks the signal. The other soatomic clock is in the window communicates with the mother ship every night. It is the reference. My "blind" clock uses its own crystal that is fast by 3 seconds a day. Every few days I have to move the small LED clock to the window and leave it sit overnight.





This is really unacceptable. There is a new digital protocol (binary phase shift keying) being sent out from Colorado that according to Larry would have no problem getting to a clock under the TV screen. But alas, the only clock/receiver available at this time is a 14" diameter round dial clock. . . https://www.lacrossetechnology.com/products/404-1235ua-ss I'm hoping they

someday make this "ultraAtomic" clock available in 2" high numbers clock for under the TV screen.

Larry McDavid shared with us his work bench area and the frequency reference at the very bottom. He showed us how he compares clocks with different source: WWVB vs. GPS time standard.











His solution was a drying oven made out of a Styrofoam box and temperature controller.




When Bill came to the last slide of his presentation his screen saver was apparent. This was before he relinquished the Zoom screen to the next person who speaks. It was of Death Valley.
