FRC Members participate in WINTERHEAT

Fullerton Radio Club members have been warming up the local airwaves by participating in WINTERHEAT, a VHF/UHF FM simplex communications event. WINTERHEAT is a month-long amateur radio event conducted annually in the month of January to help promote simplex FM amateur radio on the VHF and UHF bands.

Although WINTERHEAT started in Illinois as a regional emergency communications exercise, it is growing into a nationwide event. This event operates on predetermined frequencies in the 6 m, 2 m, 1.25 m, 70 cm, and 33 cm bands and uses an over-the-web QSO tracking database that displays event totals in real time as the event progresses. It's fun, but also good emergency preparation to practice communication with other club members with without the use of repeaters. We often talk about amateur radio saving the day when all the cell towers go down during a disaster, but what isn't as often discussed is that the majority of repeaters are likely to be off the air during an extended power outage.

Although the event started on January 1, FRC members started participating last week. The operators who have been active so far are AD6QF, K0OV, KB6A, WB6JDH, and WB6WUW. Also registered so far are WB6OZZ and friend of the club K6MBL.

To help facilitate contacts, AD6QF started by operating from the highest parking lot at Hillcrest Park. As of this writing, we have completed about forty contacts.

If you would like to join us, you can sign-up at hamactive.com. We meet daily at 1 pm, starting on 147.57 MHz. If you are undecided about participating, why not at least listen for us?
