March 2023 Board Meeting Minutes

The March 2023 Board meeting began with casual discussions at 5:28PM on March 1 by Zoom with President Larry McDavid W6FUB presiding. Additional members present were Vice President Robert Gimbel KG6WTQ, Secretary Paul Broden K6MHD, Board Members Bob Houghton AD6QF, Walter Clark and Bart Pulverman WB6WUW Absent was Treasurer Gene Thorpe KB6CMO.

Minutes from the February 2023 Board Meetings were reviewed and approved.

Treasurer's report: US Bank checking account balance: \$6,740.21 as of the end of 2/28/23.

Expenses yet to be paid are \$200 for renewal of ARRL liability insurance plus fees for use of Bob's Zoom license.

Membership: Two membership renewals were received, making the total membership at 27 paid plus 1 life member as of 2/28/23. There are no new members.

<u>Upcoming Activities</u>: Antennas In The Park, including the popular Hidden Transmitter Hunt, is planned for Saturday May 13. Details of the event will be posted in next month's newsletter.

Suggestions were made for fieldtrips or tours as Club activities. Walter will contact Fullerton Police Department for a private Club visit and tour of their facility. We will need to determine how many Club members will attend. Larry suggested a potential presentation from whatever agency oversees the process of stormwater/rain runoff management within Orange County.

A brief discussion was held to determine if any of the Board members had identified subject material or articles for inclusion in the newsletter. One article has been received from Bart Pulverman. Bart also had some recent work done on his antenna tower, and Larry suggested that information related to this type of work availability might be appropriate to list in the newsletter. Bart will follow-up with gathering this information.

Old Business: The Zoom meeting backup process seems to be working. A practice session for alternate host operation will be scheduled between Larry and Bob.

New Business: A potential for a Zoom meeting speaker presentation was identified by Bart. The subject is related to the evolution of news reporting, equipment, and technology. The presentation date is yet to be determined.

There being no further identified business the meeting was adjourned at 6:22PM.

Unlisted Japanese Amateur Licenses; a Solution

Over the past year or more that I have been operating on FT8 I have noticed that a steadily growing number of Japanese stations I have worked are not listed on QRZ, eQSL, or HamQTH.com. My current list of such stations includes 260 contacts. When I worked those stations, I consistently logged the name and QTH information as "NOT LISTED".

Today, I searched one more time for an online index of "unlisted" stations and was successful. There is one major negative about the site I found, other than the cumbersome manor in which it lists information. The

http://motobayashi.net/callsign/licensesearch.shtml? target=jg1iif, is not a "secure site"; l.e., it is flagged with a triangle and labeled "Not Secure" to the immediate left of my browser's URL bar since it does not have a VPN. I have decided to take a chance and start using it anyway and see if there are any negative repercussions. In any case, although the site shows QTH information, most of the listings show the licensees name as "(Not Disclosed)".

If you have any information about or ideas on how to identify these "ghost" stations, please let me know.

My wife and I recently returned from several weeks of camping in the deserts of Southern California and Arizona. In addition to hiking, wildflower identification, birdwatching, museum visits, cave tours, and other touristy things, I took this opportunity to activate six

parks for the Parks on the Air awards program. Five of these parks were first-time activations for me.

When operating a ham station while traveling, it's always more fun for me if I get to make contacts with friends from back home. I was fortunate to make multiple contacts with several folks who are FRC Zoom regulars.

While my favorite POTA configuration might best be described as "picnic table portable," on this winter trip, the weather was pretty chilly (including snow one day) at our locations, so at all but one of the parks, I set up the IC-7300 on the dining table of my 17-foot Alto camping trailer. On most of the activations, my antenna of choice was a SOTABeams Bandhopper II 40 / 20 meter linked dipole set up as an inverted-vee by using a 7 meter fiberglass push-up mast as a center support. In locations where there was not enough space in my campsite for a full size 40-meter antenna, I used instead a 17 foot Chameleon non-resonant vertical with a single 25 foot counterpoise.


