Perhaps the more interesting way in which we have been busy, is the forming of Special Interest Groups, or SIGs. I'll talk more about our SIGs in another article.

Although I was busy with club business, I was also busy in a more fun way. In January, my wife and I spent three weeks camping, hiking, and playing radio in several desert state and national parks. We visited Death Valley National Park, Valley of Fire State Park in Nevada, Buckskin Mountain State Park, on the Arizona side of the Colorado River, near Parker. We also visited Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument and Anza-Borrego State Park. I carried my Icom IC-7300 radio as well as a couple of easy to deploy antennas. At all five parks I was able to successfully activate the parks for POTA (Parks on the Air) while also making SSB contacts with several FRC members from each of the five parks.

JANUARY 2024 FRC BOARD MEETING

The monthly FRC Board Meeting was called to order by President Bob Houghton AD6QF at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, February 7, 2024. All Board Members were present.

The January Board Meeting minutes were reviewed and approved.

Treasurers Report:

- Bank balance as of January 31, 2024: \$6503.36
- New deposits of \$45 were made on 2/2/24 for membership renewals, making the updated balance at \$6548.36 (unverified).
- There were no new members, but two showed some interest with visits on Zoom.
- Bob's records now show paid memberships at 28 plus one life member.
- New expenses included \$159 paid to Bob Houghton as reimbursement for our use of the club's Zoom account.
- ARRL Liability insurance will be due soon. The cost has been \$200 in past years, but no invoice has been received yet.

Old Business:

• Planning for SIGs has begun, and discussions will continue this evening at 7 p.m. A proposed listing of the SIGs is posted at our website fullertonrtomradioclub.org.

New Business:

- FRC 2023 tax forms, IRS 990N and State of California 199-N have been filed as e-postcards. Copies have been provided to all Board Members for maintenance of records.
- Several Special Interest Groups (SIGs) have been formed. Additional planning will continue. New activities may include
- Saturday in a park with portable operation and potential mentoring of new hams
 - Visiting the Claremont swap meet followed by lunch for attendees.
 - Some sort of weekly on-the-air activity
 - · Record keeping, and membership listing confidentiality were discussed.
 - A brief discussion was held regarding the 2023 budged recap, as well as questions about the potential discontinuation of the PO box or an alternate mailing option. PO box price continues to increase! The decision was made to retain use of the PO box, at least for now.
 - · A brief discussion also addressed the total amount in our bank account, as compared with recommendations made by the National Council of Non-Profits. No decisions were made to modify our bank account holdings.
